Treatment	Molluscum Contagiosum
For the treatment of	Molluscum Contagiosum
Background	From April 2013, NHS England took over responsibility for commissioning activity in primary care, where initial conservative treatment takes place. NHS Scarborough and Ryedale CCG is responsible for commissioning activity in secondary care, and this policy sets out the referral criteria for the referral to secondary care for the management of Molluscum Contagiosum.
Definition	 Molluscum Contagiosum is a common self-limiting viral skin infection caused by a pox virus Young children are most commonly affected but it can also affect older children and adults Infection causes small shiny papules with an umbilicated centre Images – click here
	 Exclude Red Flag Symptoms If very widespread, numerous and persistent consider immunosuppression and HIV test if appropriate
Management	 Most cases are self-limiting with resolution within 18 months so no treatment is required Any surrounding eczema should be managed with standard eczema therapy Molludab® (potassium hydroxide) is not commissioned and should not be prescribed Smoking cessation and weight loss (if appropriate) to be encouraged
Indications for referral	Refer to Dermatology if: Molluscum contagiosum in immunosuppressed patients Diagnostic uncertainty of a solitary lesion
Investigations prior to referral	None required
Information to include in referral letter	 Site and number of lesions Duration of lesions Details of how the patient meets the referral criteria Treatments and interventions, current and past tried including the results Photograph Is desirable if solitary lesion Drug history (prescribed and non-prescribed)
