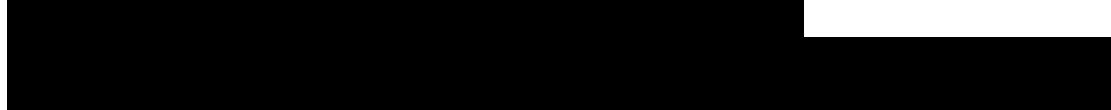

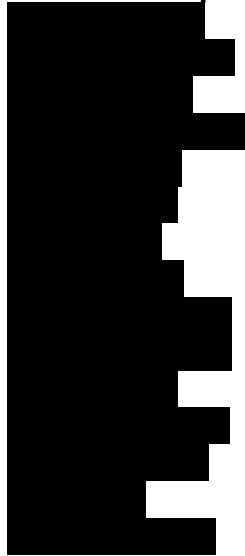

2	Welcome and apologies Members were welcomed to the meeting. A total of nine GP Practices were represented.	

3	<p>Agree action notes meeting held on 5 June 2019 The action notes were agreed as a true and accurate record of the meeting.</p>	
4	<p>Presentation on the merger of three North Yorkshire CCGs Andy Hudson gave an update to members on the proposed merger of the three North Yorkshire CCGs. Questions asked: (KT) Are mergers happening across England? It was confirmed that a number of CCGs have already merged and some are in the process of merging.</p> <p>Members were advised the CCG will continue to be a GP commissioning service.</p> <p>DR asked what would happen to this group. Members were advised that if the merger was successful they would be looking at an engagement model that was consistent across the whole of North Yorkshire. At this stage the group would continue as usual.</p> <p>SM raised concern regarding the STP footprint, suggesting it would be better to be an NYCC CCG area, which would include the North Ryedale and York area, it is confusing that not all are involved.</p> <p>(A copy of the presentation attached)</p>	
5	<p>Presentation delivered by Dementia Forward and Alzheimer’s Society Amanda Stevens, Area Manager and Tim Kirkup, Chair of Scarborough Dementia Action Alliance. (A copy of the presentation attached)</p> <p>Dementia Forward work very closely with Alzheimer’s Society and Dementia Alliance. The aim is to make life better for people with dementia. Dementia diagnosis rates in Scarborough and Ryedale are trailing at under 60% (67% national ambition). This is recognised as 780 people are predicted as having dementia but are undiagnosed.</p> <p>Tim Kirkup encouraged members to share the details of the services that are available and to encourage those who require the service to self-refer.</p> <p>If members are interested to have the “Dementia Friends” training delivered at their practice, to contact Bridget and your details will be shared with Tim.</p> <p>Tim also explained that there are recruitment issues in our area for psychiatrists, however there is a memory service at Cross Lane and in Malton.</p> <p>Amanda explained that everyone who contacts the service is visited in their own home. The organisations aim to help people understand that dementia is not the end and they are able to continue to do things just with adjustments. People’s lives do continue and it’s about focussing on the wellbeing.</p> <p>PPG members queried why there are so many people undiagnosed? Tim explained there was a mountain of reasons including: misdiagnosis, the length of GP appointments, some people can cope and also some people don’t want to know.</p>	

	<p>GPs are encouraged to refer patients to Alzheimer's or Dementia Forward.</p> <p>There is a Dementia Clinic in Malton that runs once per month for newly diagnosed patients, however it is only for Derwent Surgery patients.</p> <p>David Hill shared his own experiences, when his partner developed dementia.</p> <p>Action: GP Patient Participation Groups to consider the offer of Dementia Friends training being offered in the practice. PPG members also encouraged to share the self-referral number in their practice.</p>	ALL
6.	<p>Showcase of Health Hearts website AF gave members an overview to the Humber Coast and Vale Healthy Hearts website. Members were asked if they would take a few minutes out of the meeting and look over the website https://www.humbercoastandvalehealthyhearts.co.uk/ and complete a short survey providing their feedback. 7	<p>Update from CCG - members were provided with a written update which was distributed with the agenda, all members are encouraged to bring any questions to the meeting.</p> <p>Scarborough Hospital review- LM asked for an update on the review. Advised no further update received since the booklet was distributed to members at the June 2019 meeting. SM informed the group that the Trust has recently appointed a new Chief Executive.</p> <p>Digital Health Technology – Yorkshire and Humber Care Record team provided an update to members Members highlighted the increased use of acronyms throughout the brief and suggested if abbreviations are used, it would be helpful for a full description to be provided in the first instance followed by the abbreviation to be used.</p> <p>Action: BRJ to provide feedback to Yorkshire and Humber Care Record Team</p> <p>Members were asked if the CCG update continues to be helpful. Members welcomed the update and the format it was presented.</p>	BJR
