We have started a journey of significant change

- **Summer 2018**

- Governing Bodies of three North Yorkshire Clinical Commissioning groups voted to introduce a shared senior leadership team
 - NHS Hambleton, Richmondshire and Whitby Clinical Commissioning Group
 - NHS Harrogate and Rural District Clinical Commissioning Group
 - NHS Scarborough and Ryedale Clinical Commissioning Group

- **2018/19**

- The majority of the executive leadership team have been appointed and are in post

The challenges

- New models of care reflect changing patient needs, for example, bringing care closer to people's homes so that we best meet the needs of our patients
- Commissioning needs to be more efficient to meet the pace of change required to meet ever changing patient needs
- The health and care system nationally and locally is under ever increasing pressure from our ageing population
- Very significant budget challenges— we must continue to address the financial challenge
- Localism – we know that is very important to our public, patients, clinicians to understand local and community health and care needs

Improving Efficiency

The benefits of a North Yorkshire CCG

- Address the “postcode lottery”
- A more responsive service which maintains a local focus
- Commissioning at scale, better value for money
- Better commissioning decisions and therefore better outcomes for our patients
- Ensure our money is spent on the right things
- Sharing good practice across North Yorkshire to get better at what we do
- Doing the job once resulting in organisational and operational efficiencies

The formal assurance process

- **September 2019**

- Merger assessment meeting took place with NHS England (12th)
- CCG Governing Body review and sign off (26th)
- Application submitted to NHS England (30th)

- **October 2019**

- Formal panel will be held 23 October 2019 – will determine the outcome
- If agreed the three CCGs will begin operating as a single organisation (one CCG) from 1 April 2020
- The new North Yorkshire CCG will be responsible for buying health services for a population of more than 425,000 people and will have a combined annual budget in excess of £620 million.

Engagement going forward

CCGs have a statutory duty to involve the public in commissioning as well as a commitment to support continuous improvement in public participation - this is reflected in our communications and engagement strategy

- We have many areas of good practice within each locality
- We want to take a piece from each to make the best model
- We want to see how others areas work
- This is an opportunity to strive to be the best
- The engagement model will ensure each area of North Yorkshire continues to have a prominent clinical voice with patients' views noticeably represented
